SOUTH AFRICA

In a country, in which newly born children are given names like "Hope" and "Blessing", it seems almost ironic that more than 2 million children no longer have parents and many of them are sentenced to death in early childhood by an illness they contracted before they were even born.



Statistics of South Africa (Source: UNAIDS)

- 5,5 mil. people infected with HIV (the country ranks second in the world in sheer numbers of HIV infected people).
- Every 1,6 min. a person dies due to HIV (320.000 per year).
- Every hour 16 children become orphans!
 The cultural, human and economic costs are staggering.
 Out of this need the initiative VULAMASANGO (Open Gates) was founded.



THE PROJECT VULAMASANGO

THE LOCATION: The 5ha "Vulamasango Farm" in "Philippi Farmland", surrounded by the vast Townships of Cape Town. **THE PROJECT:** Multi-functional organization for children in need from the surrounding Townships.

THE AIM: Physical, social, emotional, and intellectual support for orphaned, neglected, abused and impoverished children and youths.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE (since Oct. 2009)

- 40 Children (6-18 years) from the surrounding Townships (semi- or fully orphaned, or children from socially disadvantaged backgrounds).
- Protection from the dangers of the Townships (poverty, crime, alcohol, and physical or sexual abuse).
- Programmes: Homework supervision, English lessons, sport, theatre workshops, music and artwork.
- Educational workshops (HIV/Aids, gender equality, cultural identity, etc.) and therapy-sessions (working through traumatic experiences such as crime, abuse, rape, etc.).
- Providing qualitative education by enrolling children at better schools through privately funded educational sponsorship programmes.

CRECHE / PRE-SCHOOL (since Jan. 2010)

• 40 children (2-6 years) from socially disadvantaged backgrounds from the neighbouring Township.



ORPHANAGE (since January 2011)

- Place of safety for up to 120 children (in future).
- Family units of 10 children and two house-parents.
- Holistic education (internal pre-school and After School Care, external schools).
- Financing of tertiary (University) education.
- Internal skills training (child-care, nursing, organic farming, carpentry, etc.)
- Internal basic medical care.
- · Integration of youth into an organic farming set-up.
- · Sustainability through organic vegetable farming.

ZABALAZA - African Performance Art (since 2006)

A large part of the capital needed for the running costs of Vulamasango is raised through bi-annual concert tours to Europe (Germany, Austria, Switzerland, the UK and Belgium) by a group of selected children and youth from the project, trained and accompanied by Artistic Director Xolisa Majambe, Project Manager Bongiwe Majambe and Choirmaster Lusanda Bali.

The performances consist of traditional South African songs, Apartheid struggle songs, and gospel songs, as well as traditional drumming and dancing. Through building up the children's sense of self-worth, the hugely successful tours are an artistic expression of the work done with the children and youngsters at Vulamasango and part of an emotional healing process to overcome both individual traumatic experiences as well as the shadows of South Africa's Apartheid past.
